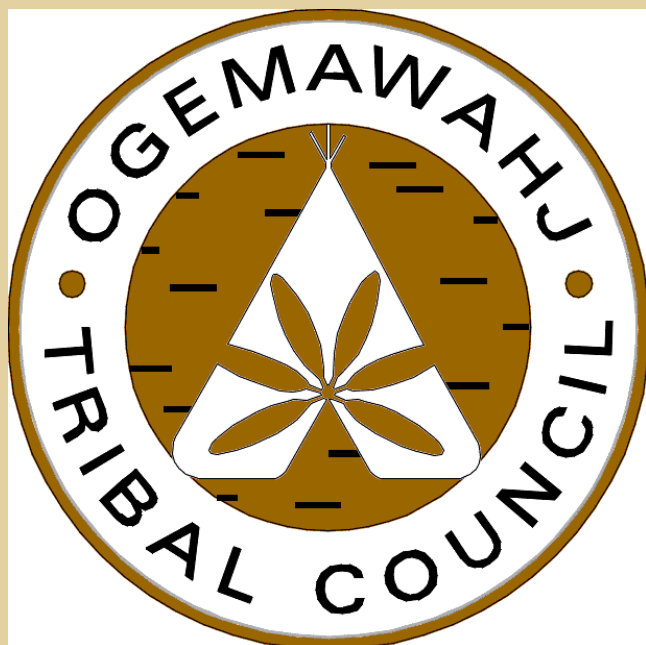


OTC DIGITIZING ANISHINAABEMOWIN PILOT PROJECT

OTC elders called on us to act not talk about revitalizing Anishinaabemowin

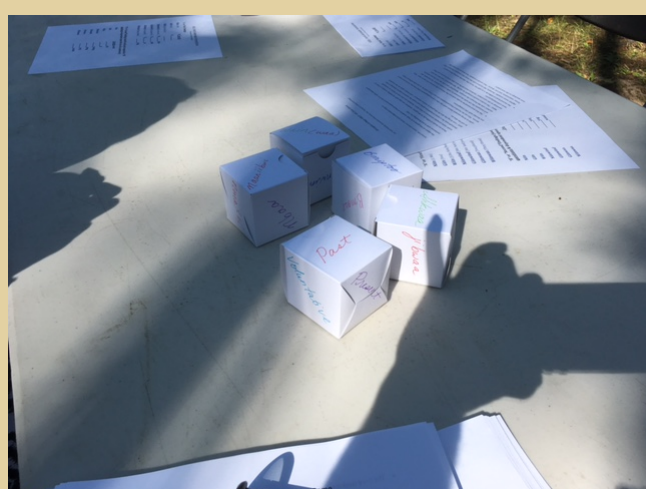
This project came from an OTC Language Champions meeting in 2019. We were asked to help take lessons and bring them to students in the world they are communicating and living in, the digital world.



WHAT WILL THE TEAMS DO?

Two OTC schools and one partner school Board

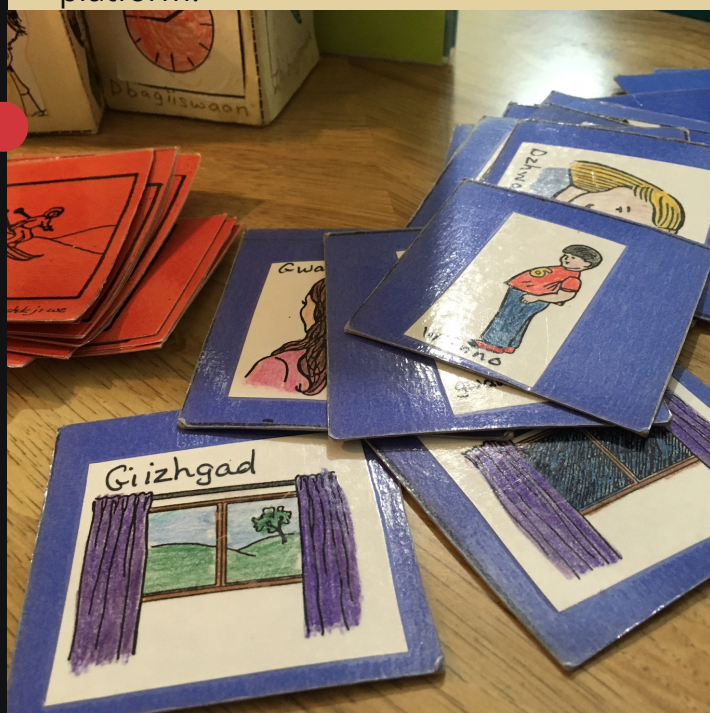
We have created teams of language teachers and community language champions to work together to bring forward either legacy lessons created by past teachers or current lessons. These lessons will be uploaded into Edwin to create a collection. These will be tested with grade 6 students. If successful, we hope to help expand the project to Anishinaabemowin classes grades 6-10 in partner school boards and First Nation schools.



WHAT IS IT?

An innovative Anishinaabemowin project

In this project, OTC First Nations partner with education publishing industry leader, Nelson. We are working with 2 First Nation schools and 1 Board of Education (Ojibwe teachers) to create a grade 6 digital lesson collection. It will be available on the Edwin digital learning platform.



WHO IS TAKING PART?

Two OTC schools and one partner school Board

We will create community teams with two schools Mnjikaning Kendasaawin Elementary and Christian Island Elementary, and Anishinaabemowin students and teachers at the York Region District School Board.
